Why was my application unsuccessful?

We do not enter into discussions regarding the rejection of an application, but our reasons for doing so might include:

- The grant beneficiaries do not live in the Wolverhampton area.
- The grant beneficiary is an individual, not an organisation.
- The applicant has not made good use of available government/council funding or support.
- The applicant's accounts suggest that the project, or organisation, is not financially sustainable.
- We feel the sum requested by the applicant is excessive or not well-allocated for its purposes.
- We have doubts as to the efficacy or management of the project or organisation.
- The reserves held are out of proportion with expenditure, with no explanation given for this.
- The purpose of the donation is unclear.
- The donation is effectively 'seed capital' for a brand-new project.
- Sometimes even excellent applications must be turned down due to budget constraints.
